

YARN

Kidsilk Haze

4 4 5 5 5 x 25gm (photographed in Degas 669)

NEEDLES

1 pair 4½mm (No 7) (US 7) needles

TENSION

22 sts and 22 rows to $10~\rm cm$ measured over patt using $4\frac{1}{\rm mm}$ (US 7) needles.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

Cluster 5 = slip next 5 sts onto right needle dropping extra loops, slip same 5 sts back onto left needle. Wrapping yarn twice round needle for each of next 5 sts and working all 5 elongated sts tog, work (K1 tbl, P1 tbl, K1 tbl, P1 tbl, K1 tbl, P1 tbl, K1 tbl) into all 5 sts.

BACK

Using 4½mm (US 7) needles cast on 97 [109: 121: 139: 151] sts loosely.

Work in patt as folls:

Row 1 (RS): Knit.

Row 2: P1, ★(P1, wrapping yarn twice round needle) 5 times, P1, rep from ★ to end.

Row 3: K1, *cluster 5, K1, rep from * to end.

Row 4: P1, *(K1 dropping extra loop) 5 times, P1, rep from * to end.

Row 5: Knit.

Row 6: P4, ★(P1 wrapping yarn twice around needle) 5 times, P1, rep from ★ to last 3 sts, P3.

Row 7: K4, *cluster 5, K1, rep from * to last 3 sts, K3.

Row 8: P4, *(K1 dropping extra loop) 5 times, P1, rep from * to last 3 sts, P3.

These 8 rows form patt.

Cont in patt until back meas 36 [37: 38: 39: 40] cm, ending with RS facing for next row.

Shape armholes

Keeping patt correct, cast off 4 [5: 6: 7: 8] sts at beg of next 2 rows. 89 [99: 109: 125: 135] sts.**

Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 [5:7:9:11] rows, then on foll 4 [5:5:7:6] alt rows, 75 [79:85:93:101] sts.

Cont straight until armhole meas 18 [19: 20: 21: 22] cm, ending with RS facing for next row.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Cast off 5 [6: 7: 9: 10] sts at beg of next 2 rows, then 5 [6: 7: 9: 11] sts at beg of foll 2 rows.

Cast off rem 55 [55: 57: 57: 59] sts loosely.

FRONT

Work as given for back to **.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 [4: 4: 4: 4] rows.

83 [91: 101: 117: 127] sts.

Work 1 [0: 0: 0: 0] row, ending with RS facing for next row.

Shape front neck

Next row (RS): Work 2 tog, patt 39 [43: 48: 56: 61] sts and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Keeping patt correct, dec 1 st at neck edge of next 6 [10: 12: 18: 18] rows **and at same time** dec 1 st at armhole edge on 2nd [2nd: next: next] and foll 0 [0: 1: 3: 5] rows, then on foll 2 [4: 5: 7: 6] alt rows. 31 [29: 30: 28: 32] sts.

Dec 1 st at neck edge only on next 20 [14: 12: 4: 4] rows, then on foll 1 [3: 4: 6: 7] alt rows.

10 [12: 14: 18: 21] sts.

Cont straight until front matches back to beg of shoulder shaping, ending with RS facing for next row.

Shape shoulder

Cast off 5 [6: 7: 9: 10] sts at beg of next row.

Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 5 [6: 7: 9: 11] sts.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to rem sts, work 2 tog, patt to last 2 sts, work 2 tog.

Complete to match first side, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES

Using 4½mm (US 7) needles cast on 55 [55: 55: 61: 61] sts.

Work in patt as given for back, shaping sides by inc 1 st at each end of 11th [9th: 7th: 7th: 5th] and every foll 12th [10th: 8th: 8th: 6th] row to 59 [69: 71: 67: 65] sts, then on every foll 14th [12th: 10th: 10th: 8th] row until there are 67 [71: 75: 79: 83] sts, taking inc sts into patt.

Cont straight until sleeve meas 41 [42: 43: 43: 43] cm, ending with RS facing for next row.

Shape top

Keeping patt correct, cast off 4 [5: 6: 7: 8] sts at beg of next 2 rows. 59 [61: 63: 65: 67] sts.


Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 rows, then on every foll alt row to 39 sts, then on foll 11 rows, ending with RS facing for next row. Cast off rem 17 sts.

MAKING UP

Press as described on the information page.

Join both shoulder seams using back stitch, or mattress stitch if preferred.
